Environmental Justice is when all people have the same access to safe and healthy living conditions. Right now, the majority of people from the global south are suffering the negative environmental consequences caused by the environmentally abusive living standards of the global north, and injustice that we need alter.

Climate change and environmental damage are the consequences of human abusive life styles and production systems, and result directly in the suffering of vulnerable groups (women, the poor, migrants etc.). The causes and effects can only be remedied and reversed by us.

Environmental Migrants should have recognized rights alike to political refugees, which at present they do not have. They are people who have to leave their home due to environmental disasters, which are more and more caused by human action. These include amongst others: food and water shortage due to climate change and/ or abusive farming.

Join us in the fight against injustice and get involved in promoting: Environmental Justice, Rights of Nature, Global Citizenship, Migrant and Refugee Rights, Stop Climate Change, Right to drinking water, One world for all, Intergenerational justice.

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
